TRUST IN THE LORD

In the Gospel this Sunday the disciples are experiencing a very rough crossing of the Sea of Galilee. They are almost overwhelmed by a storm and are on the verge of sinking. Throughout it all Jesus is asleep in the stern of the boat apparently oblivious to the mortal danger that they were in. The disciples waken Jesus, chastising him for his lack of concern



for their situation. Jesus displays his power over the elements, commanding the wind and sea to be calm. Jesus then challenges the disciples on their lack of faith. The disciples are amazed at all that has happened and ask one another "Who can this be?"

This story is one we can easily relate to our own life experience. There are times when we battle the storms of life and wonder where is God in the midst of all the turmoil. Why isn't he doing something to help us? We earnestly beseech him in prayer. Invariably God comes to our rescue and the storm gives way to a period of calm. When we reflect back on all that has taken place, we can see how our faith has been put to the test.

The story reminds us of the importance of placing our trust in God when things are difficult and never to lose hope when we feel we are on the point of being overwhelmed. God is always there for us even if we doubt his presence with us in that moment. If we seek his help in prayer, God will not let us down. In one way or another he will intervene to bring calm to whatever troubles beset us and help us regain our peace. This sense of trust and confidence in God in the face of adversity is particularly evident whenever we pray the Psalms.

We have been operating for over 40 years in Clondalkin Village and surrounding areas.

All of us are volunteers. Here's how this initiative works: referrals are made by the District Nurses and meals are provided by Peamount Hospital. We deliver 2 meals and 2 deserts on Tuesdays & Thursdays (for which there is a small charge). We have 3 routes which are looked after by several volunteer groups: 1 for Tuesday and 1 for Thursday and there is also a volunteer dedicated to collecting the meals from Peamount to distribute to the 3 routes at Knockmitten Church Car Park.

Our volunteers give 1-2 hours of their time either on a Tuesday or a Thursday, 2 weeks on/2 weeks off and this is worked out between themselves.

So, with this in mind, any new volunteers would be put in touch with the Group for whichever day they are free and they would then organise their schedule with this Group.

Also, those collecting the meals from Peamount do so a month on/month off basis, again this is organised with a team of collectors.



CARDINALS SET TO VOTE TO CANONIZE CARLO ACUTIS AND 14 OTHERS

Pope Francis will preside at an Ordinary Public Consistory on July 1, when Cardinals present in Rome are set to give the final go-ahead for the canonization of 15 Blesseds. Those Cardinals who are resident in Rome or happen to be in the city will be asked to formally vote on the causes presented to them. The ceremony is normally a formality, as the various cases have been thoroughly examined and approved by the Dicastery for the Causes of Saints. An announcement of the dates of the various canonizations is dependant on a positive vote from the Cardinals.

Church tradition has always celebrated St. Peter and St. Paul on the same day. In a sermon in 395 AD, St. Augustine of Hippo stated:

"Both apostles share the same feast day, for these two were one; and even though they suffered on different days, they were as one. Peter went first, and Paul followed. And so we celebrate this day made holy for us by the apostles' blood. Let us embrace what they believed, their life, their labors, their sufferings, their preaching, and their confession of faith."

St. Peter and St. Paul, please pray for us to grow in faith every day so that we can spend eternity with you and God in heaven.

Please pray in a special way for all of our priests and for our Holy Father, that they may remain close to the Lord.

Pray for all those discerning religious life, and for those in parish and ministry work -- that God will guide them and be their strength.

Lord, help us to overcome our doubts, fears and weaknesses. When it feels like everything is working against us, help us to feel your presence and peace.
