## **Matt Talbot**

It is just 99 years since the death of Matt Talbot. The heroic life of Matt Talbot has been promoted by the Archdiocese of Dublin for many years now. The Diocese continually invites people to reflect on Matt's life and the relevance of it for us today.

Matt Talbot was born in Dublin on 2<sup>nd</sup> May 1856. As a teenager he developed an addiction to alcohol that was to blight his life for many years. One day in 1884 when he could get nobody to buy him a drink he decided to take the pledge. In order to stay away from pubs Matt took refuge in the many churches of Dublin's inner city, visiting them frequently throughout the day. His faith life grew as a result. He developed a tremendous love of the Eucharist and he became extraordinarily close to God. He remained sober for the rest of his life. Matt died on his way to Mass in Dominick Street on 7<sup>th</sup> June 1925. On 3<sup>rd</sup> October 1975 Matt Talbot was declared Venerable by the Church. Our civic authorities too have recognised the influence of Matt's life by naming a bridge over the river Liffey after him. The Talbot Memorial Bridge, adjacent to the Custom House, was opened in 1978.

Matt's life is a witness to the fact that people can, by God's grace and their own self acceptance, say "no" to that which leads to addiction and addictive behaviour. Matt's life also demonstrates the power of the Eucharist and the strength it can give us to help us live our daily lives. With God's help, change is possible even in what may be considered the very worst of cases. We must trust in God and in ourselves.

At a time when so many people, families and communities, are affected by the scourge of alcohol, substance abuse and other addictive behaviours, Matt Talbot is put before us as a model of temperance and a source of strength and support to all who ask his intercession. Let us not hesitate to reach out to Matt in prayer, asking him to intercede with the Lord for us for the graces we need to overcome the temptations and weaknesses that may be set our lives. If you are interested, you can visit the mortal remains of Matt Talbot which lie today in the heart of Dublin, in Our Lady of Lourdes Church on Sean McDermott Street.

# St. Anthony of Padua (1195 - 1231) Feast Day 13<sup>th</sup> June

Priest and doctor of the Church.
Born in Lisbon (Portugal) in 1195;
died at Padua (Italy) in 1231.
At first an Augustinian priest and scholar, then became a Franciscan to do missionary work in north



Africa but this was thwarted by illness. Instead, he became a teacher of theology and a brilliant popular preacher in southern France and Italy, a servant of the poor, and a worker of miracles. He died in Padua aged only 36 and was canonised by Pope Gregory IX less than a year after his death. A large Renaissance basilica built over his tomb has become an international shrine visited by over 5 million pilgrims annually.
