WITNESSING FOR JESUS

Jesus summoned the twelve and sent them out in pairs with his authority to preach repentance, to cure the sick and cast out unclean spirits. Like the prophet Amos, a simple shepherd who looked after sycamore trees, nothing had prepared these Galilean fishermen for such a mission. It was to be no light-hearted holiday affair. They were to get rid of useless baggage, carry no food or money and depend solely on the hospitality of others. They were, however, allowed to take staff and sandals, symbols of the missionary lifestyle into which they were being commissioned. They were to let Christ speak and act through them.

Showing the Kingdom of God and inviting people to be part of it was Jesus' mission. He came to share his relationship with Abba, his Father and the good news that flowed from that relationship, with his followers.

Before embarking on their missionary journey the twelve disciples spent time with Jesus, accompanying him on his journeys, seeing how he related to people, how he healed and taught, how he managed the large crowds that followed him and in the midst of it all found time to pray. In The First Letter of John we read: "We declare to you what we have heard, what we have seen with our eyes, what we have looked at and touched with our hands concerning the word of life, this life was revealed, we have seen it and testify to it and declare it to you." The twelve were true witnesses. They saw, they declared what they saw. For any one of us to be true witnesses we too need to know and experience Jesus in our lives. One sure way of achieving this is through prayerful reading of the Gospels, beginning with the Gospel of Mark, the Sunday Gospel for this year. Like the first witnesses, it is the Holy Spirit who gives us the courage to act and speak and witness for Jesus. Peter, in his first sermon at Pentecost, promised the people: "You will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit, the promise is for you and your children."

Only God can perform miracles but we can offer our five loaves and two fish.

Only God can do the impossible but it is up to us to do what is possible.

We have been operating for over 40 years in Clondalkin Village and surrounding areas.

All of us are volunteers. Here's how this initiative works: referrals are made by the District Nurses and meals are provided by Peamount Hospital. We deliver 2 meals and 2 deserts on Tuesdays & Thursdays (for which there is a small charge). We have 3 routes which are looked after by several volunteer groups: 1 for Tuesday and 1 for Thursday and there is also a volunteer dedicated to collecting the meals from Peamount to distribute to the 3 routes at Knockmitten Church Car Park.

Our volunteers give 1-2 hours of their time either on a Tuesday or a Thursday, 2 weeks on/2 weeks off and this is worked out between themselves.

So, with this in mind, any new volunteers would be put in touch with the Group for whichever day they are free and they would then organise their schedule with this Group.

Also, those collecting the meals from Peamount do so a month on/month off basis, again this is organised with a team of collectors.
