Jesus, the Bread of Life

Irish medal success in the 2024 Olympic Games has been one of the big news stories of the past week. There were great crowds and joyous scenes in Dublin last Monday at the official homecoming for Team Ireland. All kinds of records were broken in Paris and it was the most successful Olympic Games ever for Irish athletes on so many levels. All our Olympic participants are a great testament to the success that commitment and dedication can achieve. Our Olympians have worked long and hard and made many necessary sacrifices over the years to attain their goal. They all deserve our most heartiest congratulations. Their success has given a tremendous lift and enlivened the spirit of the country. No doubt it will inspire many young people to new efforts in pursuing their dreams and realising their potential in the sporting arena.

All athletes have their pre and post event routines. Looking at the events in Paris over the past few weeks it is remarkable to see how many athletes engage in religious gestures before and after their events or reference God in their comments and interviews. For some there is an easy recognition and acknowledgement of how God has blessed them with a significant sporting ability or talent and they have no hesitation in saying this.

In the Gospel today, Jesus reminds us that he is the living bread that nourishes the soul. He is the one who answers the deepest longings and desires of every human heart. Jesus clearly differentiates between what he is offering in himself as the living bread and what the world has to offer. The nourishment the world offers is transient and temporary whereas the bread that Jesus offers is life-transforming and eternal.

St. Paul clearly recognised this truth. In writing to Timothy, Paul adopts the sporting imagery to make his point. He writes "I have fought the good fight to the end; I have run the race to the finish; I have kept the faith; all there is to come now is the crown of righteousness reserved for me." (2Tim 4:7-8). Paul invites us to live with commitment as we run the race of life, striving for the ultimate 'gold medal' for Christians which is eternal life with God in heaven. Let us allow Jesus to help us and nourish us in our efforts to attain this goal by welcoming him often as he comes to us as the living bread in Holy Communion.

St. Rose of Lima, Virgin

St. Rose of Lima (1586 - 1617) Feast Day 23rd August

Rose was born in Lima, Peru and named Isabel De Flores Y Del Oliva on 20 April, 1586. Her family was poor, and hoped that Isabel, growing into an extremely attractive young woman, would marry well and assist the family. From childhood Isabel was nicknamed Rose for her looks and rosy cheeks, she was more taken up with the religious world than the secular. Rose took a vow of chastity and modelled herself on Dominican St Catherine, devoting herself to a life of self-denial. Despite the ridicule of friends and family, she continued to practice extreme forms of religious observance. She fasted and became a vegetarian, mortifying her flesh with hard work and going so far as to rub lye or lime into her hands, pepper on her face and skewer her head with a long pin instead of the roses her mother put there. She wanted to turn attention away from her own beauty and focus it on God. It took her many years of prayer, fasting, hard work and secret penances before her family reluctantly agreed to let her become a member of the Third Order of St Dominic, taking vows of poverty, at twenty. She moved out of her family home into a small grotto built on their property, where she continued to devote herself to the care of the poor and infirm. Rose gladly offered up her suffering, atoning for the idolatry of her country, for the conversion of sinners, and for the souls in purgatory. Following her death at thirty-one, she was buried in the cemetery of the Dominican convent. Later, as a number of miracles were attributed to her, her remains were moved to the church of San Domingo, where she was laid to rest in a special chapel. Rose of Lima was beatified by Pope Clement IX in 1667 and canonised in 1671 by Clement X, the first canonised saint of the Western hemisphere.



We have been operating for over 40 years in Clondalkin Village and surrounding areas.

All of us are volunteers. Here's how this initiative works: referrals are made by the District Nurses and meals are provided by Peamount Hospital. We deliver 2 meals and 2 deserts on Tuesdays & Thursdays (for which there is a small charge). We have 3 routes which are looked after by several volunteer groups: 1 for Tuesday and 1 for Thursday and there is also a volunteer dedicated to collecting the meals from Peamount to distribute to the 3 routes at Knockmitten Church Car Park.

Our volunteers give 1-2 hours of their time either on a Tuesday or a Thursday, 2 weeks on/2 weeks off and this is worked out between themselves.

So, with this in mind, any new volunteers would be put in touch with the Group for whichever day they are free and they would then organise their schedule with this Group.

Also, those collecting the meals from Peamount do so a month on/month off basis, again this is organised with a team of collectors.
