It is the Spirit who gives Life

In Christianity there are non-negotiables. Jesus is not a mere menu card where we can pick and choose what we like and leave out what we do not like in His teaching. Jesus is rather a package deal. We either take Him fully on His terms and conditions or abandon Him altogether. When you and I reach a fork along the road of our Christian journey, a crisis and challenge in our discipleship, we have got to decide and choose whether we want to be faithful to Jesus or go our own way and abandon Him. He lets us go because He respects our freedom.

We can imagine what Jesus must have felt when many abandoned Him. He turns to the Twelve, and asks them "What about you, do you want to go away too?" (Jn. 6:67-71). The Twelve are the faithful ones. They do not fully understand the mystery of the Bread of Life but they believe. On their behalf, Peter answers: "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the message of eternal life, and we believe; we have come to know that you are the Holy One of God." There will be times in our life too when the challenges will be difficult and demanding. To Jesus alone must we go. In Jesus alone must we profess our conviction and commitment. Jesus alone deserves our total loyalty and love. Relationships can begin and end. But when Jesus is really our friend, come what may, we will remain faithful.

The teaching of Jesus will always remain a challenge. "A gospel with no offence, however, is like a surgeon with no scalpel, having no power to heal." The gospel cuts only to cure; it hurts only to heal. Following Jesus is always a risk. The absence of risk in our following of Jesus is a sure sign of mediocrity. We may abandon Jesus; we may desert Jesus; we may be unfaithful to Jesus. He never abandons us; He never deserts us; He remains always faithful. He cannot deny Himself. This is the heart of the Good News! Amen.

We have been operating for over 40 years in Clondalkin Village and surrounding areas.

All of us are volunteers. Here's how this initiative works: referrals are made by the District Nurses and meals are provided by Peamount Hospital. We deliver 2 meals and 2 deserts on Tuesdays & Thursdays (for which there is a small charge). We have 3 routes which are looked after by several volunteer groups: 1 for Tuesday and 1 for Thursday and there is also a volunteer dedicated to collecting the meals from Peamount to distribute to the 3 routes at Knockmitten Church Car Park.

Our volunteers give 1-2 hours of their time either on a Tuesday or a Thursday, 2 weeks on/2 weeks off and this is worked out between themselves.

So, with this in mind, any new volunteers would be put in touch with the Group for whichever day they are free and they would then organise their schedule with this Group.

Also, those collecting the meals from Peamount do so a month on/month off basis, again this is organised with a team of collectors.
