wounded earth is increasingly alarming and demands decisive and urgent action." **The Archbishop of Canterbury** stated that "In the face of climate change, protecting God's Creation is a spiritual imperative for Christians throughout the global Church." For his part, **Ecumenical Orthodox Patriarch Bartholomew of the Archbishopric of Constantinople** issued a message: "We have repeatedly expressed our belief that Churches and religions can contribute greatly to the spiritual and evaluative change that is vital for the future of humanity and our planet."

A lot is already happening around the world: Despite heavy rains in the Philippines, about 300 faithful of different Christian denominations joined in **the Ecumenical Walk for Creation 2024**; **Laudato Si' Movement's Peru Chapter** celebrated the Eucharist to inaugurate the Season of Creation in the Cathedral of Lima, presided over by the local bishop, Mons. Carlos Castillo; **The Lutheran World Federation** has prepared special resources for living the Season of Creation and encourages you to live it by participating in official events and signing the "Letter of Faith" in support of the Fossil Fuel Non-Proliferation Treaty. We are united in action and prayer during these weeks!
