JUBILEE YEAR 2025

Bishop Fintan Monahan of Killaloe has been designated by the Irish Catholic Bishops' Conference as its delegate for the Jubilee Year 2025.



A Jubilee - or Holy - Year is

marked every twenty-five years by the Universal Church as a time of dedicated prayer so as to re-establish a proper relationship with God, with one another, and with all of creation. The theme for Jubilee Year 2025 is 'Pilgrims of Hope'. This theme encourages each of us to be messengers of hope into our very troubled world. A plenary indulgence will be granted following participation in pilgrimages to designated pilgrim sites in the course of the Holy Year.

Bishop Monahan said: "The Holy Year will begin on this Christmas Eve, 24 December, with the opening of the Holy Door of Saint Peter's Basilica, Rome. To echo the theme of Holy Year, Pope Francis is calling on all Catholics to renew in the hope of Christ, using Saint Paul the Apostle as a guide for this special year. Each diocesan bishop will celebrate Mass on Sunday, 29 December, to mark the solemn opening of the Holy Year. Similarly, at national and local level for the Irish Synodal Pathway, the theme of 'Hope' will be central to many of the meetings and prayerful discernment leading towards a national assembly in 2026."
