MISSION SUNDAY 2024

The word "mission" means a task, a job, a work, a duty. The word "missionary" therefore means one who is sent to do this task, job, work and duty. Once a year, we celebrate "Mission Sunday", lest we forget that as members of the Church, we are all missionaries and have a task, a job, a work and a duty to do.

Jesus is the First Missionary. He was sent by God the Father on a mission. His mission was to preach to the whole world that God loves everyone and wants all to be saved. Jesus hands over his mission to the apostles and to the Church. "Go out to the whole world and preach the gospel to the whole of creation baptizing them, in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" (Mt. 28: 19). He has promised to be with us always, even to the end of the world. When did we receive this mission? When did we become missionaries? On the day we were baptized, we became ONE with Jesus. We began to share in His mission, to carry on and continue His mission. We are not alone on this mission. Jesus is with us to sustain, strengthen and support us. Like the apostles, having encountered Him, He enlightens and empowers us. The mission is His, the message is His. We are His messengers. How can we be missionaries? We do not necessarily have to go to Africa or South America. We can be missionaries where we are first by the quality of our Christian lives. Each of us, wherever we are, must be an attractive advertisement for Jesus by our thoughts, words and actions. When those who do not know Jesus see us, the way we live, talk and act, they must come to know Jesus. In short, each of us must be a LIVING GOSPEL which all can read. Do I by my life lead others to or away from Jesus?

The second way to be a missionary is by prayer. We have the beautiful example of St. Therese of the Child Jesus, a cloistered Carmelite who died at the age of twenty-four of tuberculosis. She never went to the missions but offered her prayer and suffering for the missions. She is the Patroness of the Missions on a par with the great St. Francis Xavier. Hers was the "little way". She said "Even if you pick up a pin from the floor with love, you can save a soul!" We must do ordinary things with extraordinary love.

Finally, we can be a missionary by giving what we can. Some give to the missions by going; others go to the missions by giving. This parish is generous. I know you give not out of your abundance, but by making sacrifices. God is never outdone in generosity. If we give Him a speck of dust, He will return a grain of gold.

The harvest is great. The labourers are few. Pray that the Lord may send labourers into His harvest. Amen.
