JESUS' TEACHING ON DIVORCE IN MARK 10

To-day's Gospel presents Jesus' radical teaching on marriage and divorce. The positive ideal he sets forth is that husband and wife become "one flesh". The fulfilment of that ideal means no divorce.

Jesus' radical teaching must be placed in the context of first century Palestine. The world of Jesus was very much a patriarchal society. Marriages were arranged between the bride's father and the groom and his father. It was a legal arrangement and a man's prerogative. Most Jews took divorce for granted. One school of thought regarded sexual misconduct on the woman's part as a reason while another school said "Even if she spoiled his dinner or found another younger or more attractive" he could divorce her. Divorce was a controversial topic among the Pharisees who forbade women from initiating it. Aware of Jesus' compassion for the vulnerable and the exploited they question him about divorce "to catch him out". They already knew the biblical answer to the question. Moses allowed divorce because of their "hardness of heart". Jesus appeals to two texts from Genesis that express God's original plan for men and women: "no longer two but one flesh" and "what God has joined together, let no man separate". From this divine ideal Jesus draws the conclusion that divorce is contrary to God's plan. In a society where it was widely accepted Jesus' positive teaching about marriage and no divorce went against custom and the cultural grain.

In the early church there was both acceptance of Jesus' "no divorce" teaching and exceptions introduced by Paul and Matthew to resolve problems that arose in mixed marriages and foreign culture practices where women could initiate divorce. There was no manifest concern for what we today call psychological incompatibility and marriage was not understood in sacramental terms.

Jesus' teaching on marriage and divorce was as radical in the first century as it is among Christian churches today. It remains a complex and difficult pastoral issue. Todays Gospel recalls the positive character of Jesus' teaching that husband and wife in marriage mirror God's original plan by becoming "no longer two but one flesh".
