## Giving with a generous heart

In the Gospel this Sunday, Jesus once again takes issue with the lifestyle of the leading religious figures of his time. Jesus is critical of their behaviour which he says is often a show or a pretence. The scribes and the pharisees are keen to be seen doing the right thing in the eyes of people who observe them. They derive pleasure from the public adulation they receive from seeming to be people of outstanding virtue. But behind it all their actions often don't measure up to the public face they portray. There is clearly hypocrisy at play here as well as duplicity and insincerity.

Jesus contrasts the behaviour of the scribes and pharisees with that of the poor widow whose behaviour is presented as being generous and exemplary. The poor widow is genuine and sincere. While the amount she contributes to the treasury may be small and insignificant in monetary terms, she gives with a generous heart. The widow is clearly making a sacrifice in giving her offering. The money donated could undoubtedly have been well used in meeting her own personal needs.

Unlike the scribes and the pharisees Jesus lived an authentic life. His actions matched his words. This is one of the factors that attracted people to him. Jesus was sincere and genuine in the love, care and compassion he showed towards all those he interacted with. The Gospel story also gives us a hint and a forewarning of what will happen with Jesus. Like the widow, Jesus will give of himself in an exceedingly abundant and generous manner. Jesus will give everything on the cross, his very life, for the salvation of all humanity.

The Gospel calls on us to be people of sincerity and generosity. We are invited to be generous with our time and resources in the service of others. Whether we are blessed with plenty by way of material wealth and assets, or whether we are people of limited means doesn't really matter. What matters is our spirit of generosity and our willingness to share what we have. It is the quality of our giving rather than the quantity that matters most. If the quality of our giving is that of a generous heart, then not only will we be seen as disciples of Jesus but our proclaimed love of God will be clearly visible in our love of neighbour

#### THE BEAVER SUPERMOON, FRIDAY 15th NOVEMBER 2024

After the stretch of dull cloudy days, hopefully the sky will be clear on Friday 15th November for viewing the Beaver Supermoon. The Moon is within 90% of its closest approach to Earth on its oval shaped orbit around Earth. The Moon will appear 14% larger and 30% brighter. Often times, the days either side of a Full Moon give better viewing when shadows show the surface features in relief. See Nasa Science for deeper knowledge.
