

ALL WHO HEARD IT WERE AMAZED

As a student, I remember hearing of a story from an elderly American Franciscan monk about an interview he watched on the TV. A group of cosmonauts were asked various questions after their return to Earth. The journalist said with enthusiasm that it must be an extraordinary feeling that you as a human being are able to go to Cosmos! One of the cosmonauts replied after pausing: "Yes, it is, but it is not that extraordinary, science made it possible. What is extraordinary to me, is that God became one of us and came down to

the Earth."

There was silence in the studio for a few moments. The journalist wasn't ready to reply to an answer like this. The room was silent for some time when this story was told to us as a bunch of students just before Christmas. Godly Play stories express so well that the Church knew a long time ago that we need time to get ready to come close to the mystery of Christmas. How close did I come to it in all these weeks presented in my precious and unique life story? All these years later, it is in the silence where it seems I can come closest to the Mystery of Christmas even when something is still not done or forgotten, is not said or said with lack of love, but now I know more deeply that God is with us in all the circumstances of our lives, in everyone and in everything. All life experiences can become like a lighthouse in the horizon of the peaceful shore and then you, Dear Reader, become a lighthouse to others as God's life and love shines through you!

The most extraordinary event happened back then, which the prophets foretold for centuries. That night the shepherds from the fields went with haste to Bethlehem to find the mystery of Christmas - child Christ lying in the manger. *'When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard*



it were amazed at what the shepherds told them." Luke 2:18. We can only imagine what this very first Christmas experience would have been like and the sight of a helpless baby in the arms of two inexperienced parents who knew so little of what was to come or even where to go from here, but they knew what mattered the most.

They knew that Emmanuel is born – God is with us and that changes everything.
