JUBILEE YEAR 2025 - 'PILGRIMS OF HOPE'



Jubilee Years - also known as Holy Years - began in 1300AD and occur every 25 years. Jubilee Years can be called at other times, such as the Year of Mercy in 2016. These Years, the Church explains, are years "of reconciliation between adversaries, of conversion and receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation, [...] and consequently, of solidarity, hope, justice, commitment to serve God with joy and in peace with our brothers and sisters.

The Year began from the opening of the Holy Door at St Peter's Basilica on the 24th December 2024 and will run till the Solemnity of the Epiphany 2026. Archbishop Farrell celebrated Mass for the Solemn Opening of the Jubilee Year at St Mary's Pro Cathedral on Sunday 29th December 2024.

We are all pilgrims on our journey towards the Lord. There are many opportunities to deepen our life of faith and relationship with God. Look out for Jubilee resources, courses and devotionals from our Diocese and the Bishops' Conference, also the parish events or initiatives offered by the Parish Partnership.

Pope Francis is also encouraging us to rediscover the ancient practice of pilgrimage during 2025. All are invited to join our Diocesan pilgrimages to Knock in April, Lourdes in September, Jubilee of Youth in Rome, 'Rome @ Home' Youth weekend, make a pilgrimage to Glendalough, or visit a Jubilee church in Dublin City Centre to visit Pockets of Hope. You are invited to journey the pilgrim path of Pockets of Hope in Dublin city and reflect on the message of Hope this Jubilee Year.

See if you can find time to visit our own Jubilee Churches in the Archdiocese: St Mary's Pro Cathedral, Marlborough Street; St Andrew's, Westland Row; Our Lady of Lourdes, Sean McDermott Street; Church of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, City Quay; St Kevin's Parish Church, Glendalough.
