

THE MISSION OF JESUS

In today's Gospel Luke tells us that Jesus returns to his own town of Nazareth after his Baptism in the Jordan and forty days in the desert. He enters the synagogue on the Sabbath. The scroll of the Book of Isaiah is handed to him and he reads from it: "The spirit of the Lord has been given to me...he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor, liberty to captives, sight to the blind, freedom to the downtrodden, and to proclaim the Lord's year of favour".

Luke wants us to know that the mission of Jesus was Spirit anointed, Spirit led, Spirit empowered and Spirit fulfilled. All that Jesus said and did was connected to God and Old Testament promises. The mission of Jesus included all of life. He walked among the people teaching and healing, confirming that the power of God was with him. After his death and Resurrection he returned to the Father passing on the baton to his followers to carry on the same mission of taking God to the world:

"Go make disciples of all nations, baptising them, teaching them to follow all that I command you. I am with you always". Matt 28:19-20.

As followers of Jesus we are called to carry on his mission by recognising God's presence in our lives. God is at work in our world through us. The mission of Jesus is as relevant today as it was in Jesus' time. We continue his mission by praying for labourers for the harvest and for the lost, by loving and serving God in the people around us, by letting our light shine through acts of love and mercy, by speaking of God's love.

Invite others to believe. It is God's harvest. We are not responsible for the results of the mission. We can only do our part and do it well.

In January 2023, Pope Francis described evangelizing this way:

"It does not begin by trying to convince others but by bearing witness every day...We proclaim the Lord. We do not proclaim ourselves. We proclaim Jesus. We need to put Jesus in contact with people without convincing them but allowing the Lord to do the convincing...The Church grows by attraction".

St. Angela Merící - Feast Day 27th January

St Angela Merici was born in Desenzano (Italy) about 1474; died in Brescia on 27th January 1540. She became a Franciscan tertiary and subsequently founded the Company of Saint Ursula (Ursulines). Her vision provided an alternative to the forms



of religious life then available for women: members remained in their own homes, living as virgins and observing a rule she composed. Honoured as a woman of prayer, for her evangelical way of life, for her pilgrimages, and for her creative response to the needs of women in the Church.
