3rd Sunday of Lent

A CALL TO REPENTANCE

Not much has changed in our world since the time of Jesus. Tyrants are still ruling. Buildings are still falling. Tragedies are still happening.

Pontius Pilate was the Roman Governor of Judea during the last years of Jesus' ministry. He was a high handed and stern ruler who had no love for the Jews. In today's Gospel Luke refers to a violent act committed by Pilate against Galileans "whose blood he mingled with their sacrifices" in the Temple. When Jesus is told about the killing he does not condemn Pilate. Neither does he say that the people on whom the Tower of Siloam fell were more sinful than others. He moves the focus away from why these things happened to how we should live our lives here and now. "Repent" was Jesus' answer. "If you do not repent you will all perish as they did" God did not single them out and punish them for their sins. These events were a warning, a reminder to all, that one day, we too, will die.

Repentance is about changing our lives to conform to God's will. It is about admitting our failures and desiring to do better. In the language of the Parable of the Fig Tree it is about bearing fruit that will last. Jesus tells a parable about an unfruitful fig tree. In the Old Testament the fig tree was a symbol for Israel just as the shamrock is for Ireland. When the fig tree bore fruit the nation flourished. When the fig tree was barren the nation was displeasing to God. The people understood that Jesus was talking about them and their relationship with God. Rather than cut down the fig tree the gardener pleads for more time to do more work to help the tree grow. If not, then the tree can be cut down.

God is the giver of second chances. He is patient with us because of his deep love for us. Notice that twice in today's Gospel Jesus says: "Unless you repent you will all perish". The key to all Jesus' teaching is repentance.

Our Lenten journey began with the words "Repent and believe in the Gospel." Let us continue as we began.

POPE FRANCIS RELEASES HIS MESSAGE FOR THE UPCOMING WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS, AND INVITES



YOUNG PEOPLE TO LISTEN TO GOD'S VOICE IN THEIR HEARTS SO THEY MAY BE SIGNS OF HIS LOVE FOR OUR WORLD.

As he recovers from bilateral pneumonia at Rome's Gemelli Hospital, Pope Francis has released his message for the 62nd World Day of Prayer for Vocations, which falls this year on May 11. Entitled "Pilgrims of Hope: The Gift of Life," the Pope's message recalls that every vocation—be it to ordained ministry, consecrated life, or the laity—should offer the world a sign of God's hope for every person. At certain points in life, added the Pope, God calls people to choose a path, whether it be to family life, the priesthood, or religious life. "Every vocation is inspired by hope, marked by confident trust in God's providence," he said. "Vocations mature through the daily effort to be faithful to the Gospel, and through prayer, discernment and service."

In conclusion, Pope Francis invited all Christians to pray for vocations and trust that the Holy Spirit will inspire young


THE CLOCK OF LIFE
